INTRODUCING THE ADMINISTRATIVE DISTRICT

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LOCATION + TASKS ... AND ITS LOCATION

The district of Fürstentfeldbruck is one of 71 districts in Bavaria and among the 20 districts of Upper Bavaria. It abuts the Bavarian capital Munich in the east, the districts of Starnberg and Landsberg in the south, and the districts of Dachau and Aichach-Friedberg in the west and north.

The district comprises 23 cities and municipalities, two of which are large district cities. The district covers an area of 43,500 hectares and has a population of 219 000 (as of December 2019). It is the second most densely populated district in Bavaria after Munich.



... AND ITS TASKS

In order to perform the various different tasks of a district, the district administration (Landratsamt) has more than 1,000 employees. The tasks of a district consist of those pertaining to own district responsibilities and those transferred from the state (according to Article 5 and 6 Bavarian district regulation, Bayerische Landkreisordnung). In the scope of its self-governed responsibilities, the district is concerned with issues related to its community.

In this scope of responsibility, it creates, within the boundaries of its financial and personnel capability, the public institutions necessary for the economic, social, and cultural well-being of its citizens. There is a distinction between mandatory tasks and voluntary tasks.

Mandatory tasks comprise in particular the construction and maintenance of district roads, the establishment and maintenance of hospitals, the education-

nal financing of the secondary state schools (vocational schools in particular), school transport, youth and social welfare, promotion of garden culture and landscape management and waste management. Voluntarily, the district can be active in the field of organising district-related public transport, the supra-local preservation of monuments and cultural maintenance, sports promotion, economy and tourism. Within the scope of self-governing tasks, the district is only bound to legal regulations; superior authorities are not permitted to issue specialist instructions.

This does not apply to the scope of "transferred activities". This scope comprises tasks the district is obliged to carry out by law. This includes for example issuing safety regulations, meat inspection, benefits pursuant to housing allowance and livelihood support laws as well as organising disaster and emergency services.

The district administration not only is a district entity, but as lower state administrative authority also an entity of the Free State of Bavaria.



... AND ADMINISTRATIVE BUILDINGS

Our main building is located in the Münchner Straße 32 in Fürstenfeldbruck and was inaugurated in 1973, while the annex which houses the citizen service center was built in 2002.

Even though space for many new employees was created while renovating the main building, the available space still isn't enough. Another annex is underway, which will provide room for 112 new office jobs as well as 121 additional parking spots will be created on a parking deck integrated into the building complex. There will be a total of 168 bicycle parking spots available. As a new development, up to 20 charging stations for electric vehicles will be installed. The photovoltaic system planned on the roof is compliant with the standard of many new buildings in the district area.

A ROYAL HISTORY

... AND ITS HISTORY

During the time of the Kingdom of Bavaria, under the administration of Minister of State Maximilian Joseph Count von Montgelas, Bavaria was organised in departments based on the French model. In this process, the area that is now the district of Fürstenfeldbruck was allocated to the Isar District, which later became the administrative region of Upper Bavaria. For the partly identical area of the former Fürstenfeld Abbey and a few other municipalities the revenue office of Fürstenfeldbruck (the predecessor of the present-day tax office) was established in 1821.

By royal edict of King Maximilian I. Joseph on 29 October 1823, the new judicial district of Fürstenfeldbruck was formed from parts of the judicial districts of Dachau and Landsberg and was later extended by several municipalities from the judicial districts of Starnberg and Weilheim. In 1861, a separation of jurisdiction and administration was implemented. In addition to the district judge, the position of the district official was created, which later became the head of district administration (Landrat).

On 1 January 1939, the term "district" (Landkreis) was established.



The district of Fürstenfeldbruck has only existed in its present-day form for a relatively short period of time. The last municipality was included in 1956, when the Munich neighbourhood of Gröbenzell was merged with three other municipalities to form the municipality of Gröbenzell, which was then integrated into the district. The last territorial reform was undertaken in 1972. As a result, the district of Fürstenfeldbruck "lost" the municipalities of Baierberg and Steindorf to the district of Aichach-Friedberg, the municipality of Ebertshausen to the district of Dachau and the municipality of Geltendorf to the district of Landsberg am Lech. In 1977, the municipality area of Dirlesried was added, which had previously been a part of the district of Dachau and has since been a part of the municipality of Egenhofen.

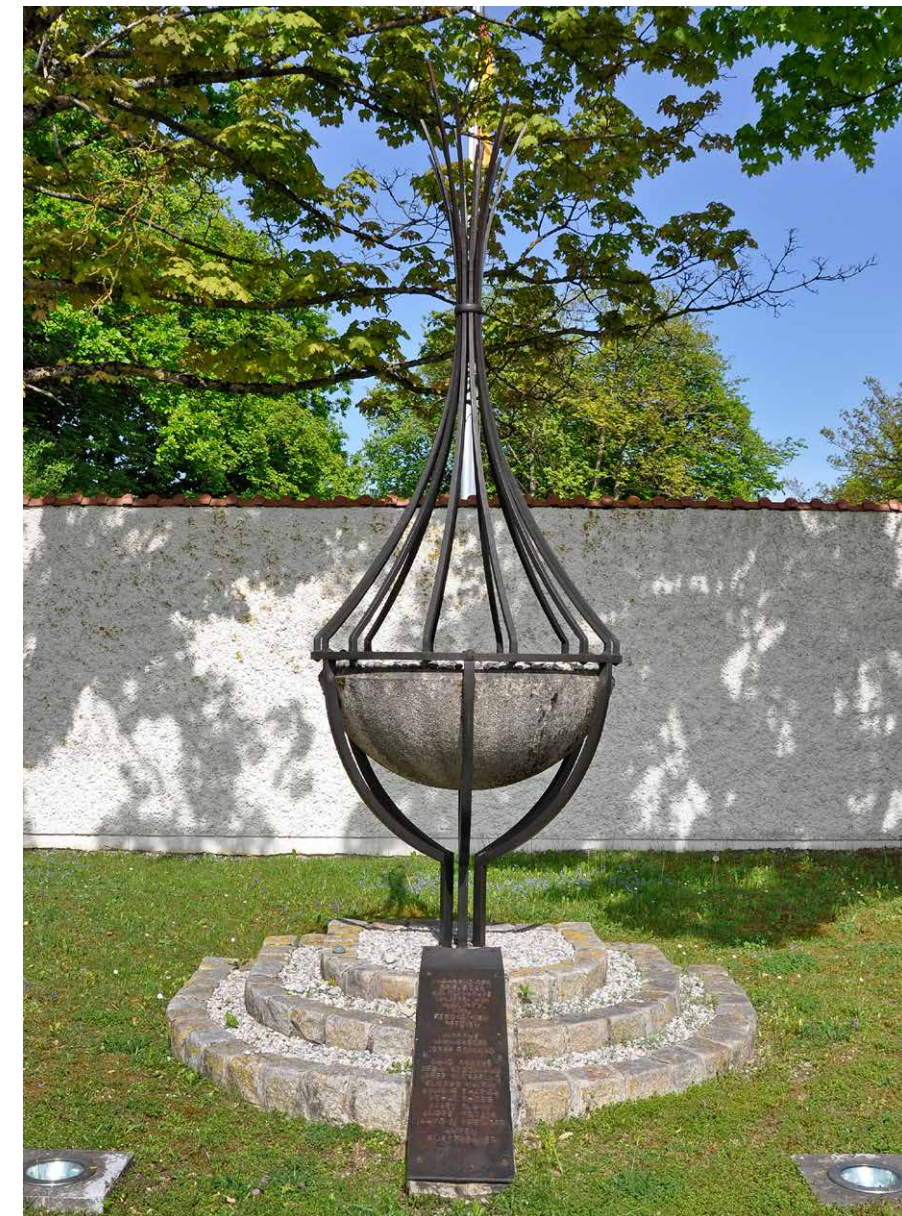
“In the final of the war, in April 1945, prisoners from the Kaufering and Landsberg concentration camps passed through here on their death march into the unknown.”

Sculptor Hubertus von Pilgrim created this memorial which has now been erected in the same form at 23 sites to mark the route of suffering forced upon thousands of concentration camp prisoners, most of whom died on the way. The first memorial was installed in Gauting in 1989. In 1992, the installation

took place at the Yad Vashem Holocaust Memorial in Jerusalem. In 1994, this memorial was erected in the city of Fürstentfeldbruck as well. Since then, it has served as a memorial site where the victims of the Nazi regime are commemorated every year on January 27.



LEGACY AND COMMITMENT

THE END OF THE CHEERFUL GAMES

On September 5, 1972, Fürstentfeldbruck suddenly found itself at the centre of global attention: A terrorist attack on Israeli Olympic team members carried out by Palestinian militant group Black September came to a disastrous end at the Fürstentfeldbruck Air Base. The attackers killed all nine Israeli hostages – David Berger, Ze'ev Friedman, Yossef Gutfreund, Eliezer Halfin, Kehat Schor, Amitzur Shapira, Mark Slavin, Andrei Spitzer, and Yakov Springer. One German police officer died as well. The attack also cost five of the eight perpetrators their lives.

MEMORY WORK TO OVERCOME POWERLESSNESS

The memory work regarding the tragic outcome of the Munich Massacre 1972 is of particular importance to the citizens of the district of Fürstentfeldbruck. In order to address this concern, the district authorities have organised annual commemorative events on September 5, erected a memorial by the artist Hannes L. Götz at the main gate of the air base, and opened an exhibition in the old control tower. Several publications and a series of lectures have also been devoted to this topic. The district is consistently committed to turning this authentic site into a memorial site. The aim is to keep alive the memory of the victims as well as sympathy for relatives and survivors of the Munich massacre. To fulfil this purpose, a digital memorial will be established, offering a unique form of remembrance and making commemoration and information about the massacre accessible worldwide.

... AND ITS NAME

In 1263, Cistercian monks from Aldersbach Abbey founded Fürstenfeld Abbey, an expiatory monastery for Louis the Strict, Duke of Bavaria, on the "Field of the Prince" (Feld des Fürstens), thus giving rise to the name of the abbey. "Brück" in turn referred for many centuries only to the local market on the bridge over the Amper. Although the name "Fürstenfeldbruck" appears in

some monastery sources as early as the 18th century, it was not used in official documents until after 1803. However, even afterwards, the name was not used consistently, as the area continued to be referred to as "Bruck" or "Bruck near Fürstenfeld" until the beginning of the 20th century.

... COAT OF ARMS

According to the ruling of the district council from June 30, 1967, the district of Fürstenfeldbruck received a new, meaningful coat of arms which commemorates the foundation of the duke's monastery and the market town of Bruck.

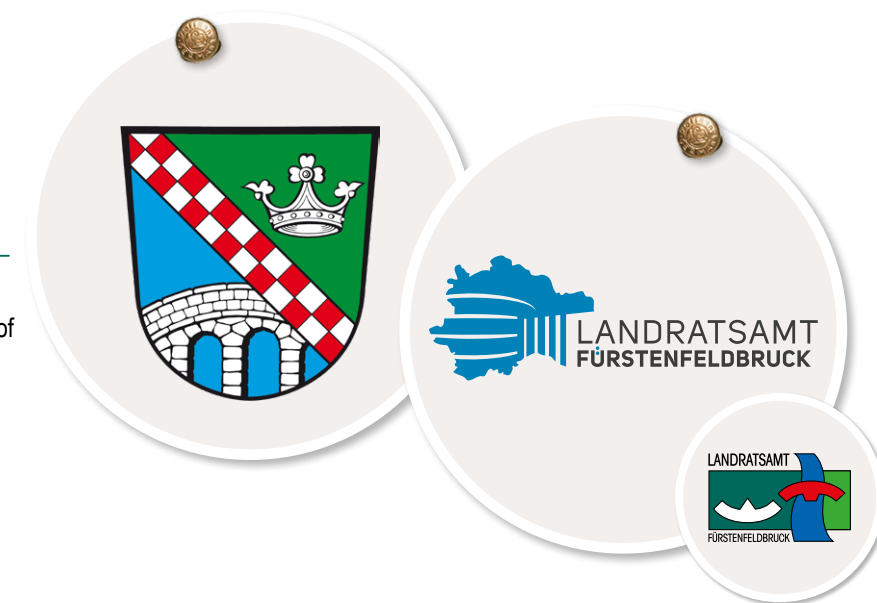
DESCRIPTION OF THE COAT OF ARMS

"Silver and red two-row checkered bend parts the shield into green and blue; at the top a silver princely crown, below a silver three-arched stone bridge."

HISTORICAL MEANING OF THE COAT OF ARMS

A diagonal checkered bend serves as a family coat of arms of St. Bernard (Bernard of Clairvaux), the founder of the Cistercian Order. The crown in form of the princely leaf crown indicates the relationship to the former rulers who played a decisive role in the foundation of the monastery.

At the same time, this crown is a heraldic symbol from the coat of arms of the abbot Alexander Pellhammer. During his tenure, a famous and architecturally highly significant abbey church in Fürstenfeld was completed. The arched bridge represents the market town of Bruck. The heraldic design is based on the coat of arms of the market town that was valid until 1936. On the coat of arms, the princely crown and the bridge clearly visualise the name of the district.



... AND OFFICIAL LOGO

... AND CULTURE

Fostering culture and heritage are highly valued. Four local historians as well as two district archivists are making sure that tradition, culture, monuments and archives will not be forgotten. Special highlights include the traditional ride Willibaldsritt in Jesenwang, the Luzienhäuschenschwimmen on the Amper river, the votive service Leonhardifahrt in Fürstenfeldbruck and a traditional horse ride on the last day of the year, the Silvesterritt in Türkenfeld.

The district of Fürstenfeldbruck is home to various museums offering a lot to discover. Travel through time and space in Germering, learn about peppermint plantation in Eichenau, find information on planting peat moss in Gröbenzell, or explore the changing exhibitions in the city museum Fürstenfeldbruck.

The district offers another excellent museum to experience history: the farm museum Jexhof, near Schöngeising. It's where history comes alive. In addition to presenting a traditional farm from about 100 years ago, the museum offers changing special exhibitions and a wide range of educational programmes.

... OUR LANDSCAPE

The differently structured geological history results in an appealing visual of the landscape.

The northern parts of the district with their wide and gently rolling hills belong to the tertiary period. The middle part consists of old moraine landscape with gravel fields from the ice age. The southern part belongs to the younger moraine landscape. The Eastern part of the foothills is the beginning of the large Munich gravel plain.

The Steingassenberg northwest of Türkenfeld is the highest point above sea level with 624 m, the lowest with 493 m above sea level lays in the Ampertal near Geiselbullach in the town of Olching. The longest N-S extension is 25 kilometres, the longest E-W extension 34 kilometres.

The characteristics of the Brucker Land are the large moss-covered lowlands: the Ampermoos, the Haspelmoor in the municipality of Althegnenberg, the Wildmoos near Moorenweis and the Allinger Moos as well as the Fußbergmoos near Maisach.

The Amper river is the main tributary which flows through the district, followed by the Maisach and smaller streams.

... AND OUR PUBLIC TRANSPORT

The main traffic and access roads are the A8 Munich–Stuttgart motorway and the A99 with the “Eschenrieder Spange” in the north-east and east, as well as the A96 Munich-Lindau in the south; the federal roads B 2 and B 471 pass through the district.

MVV transport area of Fürstenfeldbruck

The district of Fürstenfeldbruck is a strong partner in the Munich Transport and Tariff Association (MVV). With this the district population and all the visitors from nearby and far away can use all means of transport in the MVV easily and conveniently at just one rate – especially the widespread range of 56 regional bus routes and the RufTaxi routes in the district. A part of the MVV network area are three S-Bahn train lines (S3, S4, S8) which connect our district to Munich. Two regional train lines (R970, R980) give you the best connection to Augsburg, Buchloe and Munich.

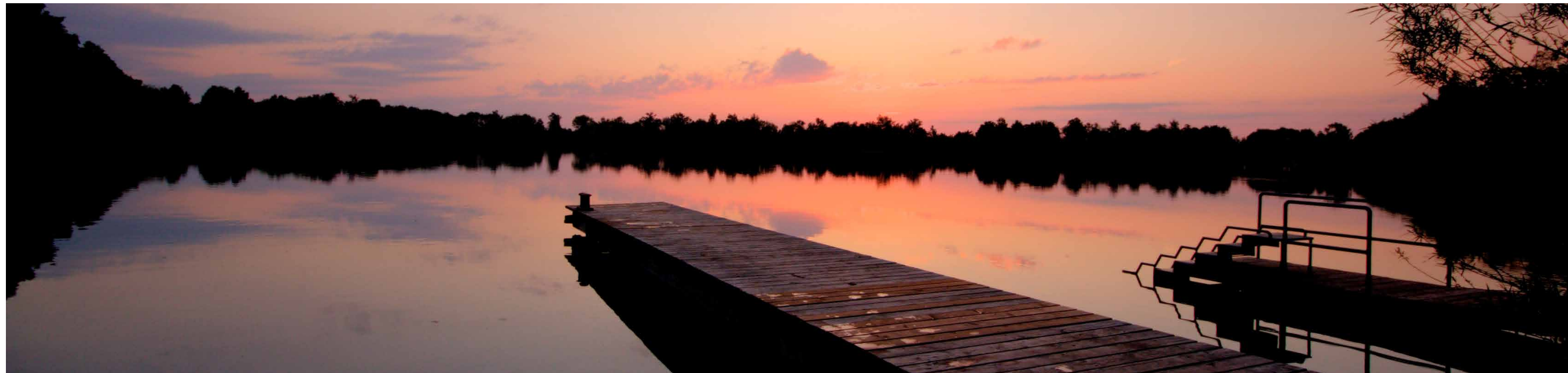

... AND LOCAL RECREATION AND LEISURE

Located right next to Munich, the administrative district of Fürstentfeldbruck is a region with strong contrasts between modernity and tradition.

Many unspoiled natural landscapes, local recreation areas, the theme park in Mammendorf, modern indoor and outdoor pools as well as numerous golf clubs are perfect for relaxation.

Some of the highlights worth visiting are the former monastery grounds of Fürstentfeldbruck with its magnificent baroque monastery church. Well-maintained traditions include local fairs, the big Fasching parade in Olching, the Willibald, Leonhardi and Silvester rides as well as the Luzienhäuschen-schwimmen on the Amper river. The well-developed cycling network as well as various tours through the district and long distance cycling roads such as the "Ammer-Amper-Radweg" lead to impressive locations and places of interest and therefore offer cycling fun for all demands. The traditional gastronomy spoils its visitors with Bavarian delicacies or international dishes and beer crafted by local breweries.





Swim and relax in the spacious outdoor pool of the theme park in Mammendorf. It also contains Europe's largest in-ground water slide. In the immediate vicinity is a well-equipped youth campsite.

Other numerous swimming pools and lakes with different sizes also offer local recreation in the district.

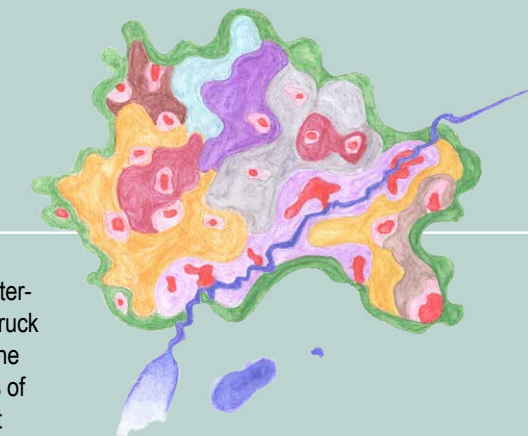
companies with a strong global reputation form a strong economic structure. A distinct cultural and creative economy is another aspect for a versatile and robust local economy.

... AND OUR FUTURE

The referendum for spacious planning and development initiated the inter-municipal "Spacial Development Strategy of the district of Fürstenfeldbruck (RES)". The local council passed the RES in 2017 as a general guideline to help the municipalities control their spacial development in the areas of living, free spaces, mobility and economy. The RES forms an important basis for the future of the district and the municipalities.



The Spacial Development Strategy provides key guidelines, including:

- Sensitive landscape areas are regarded as off-limits and remain untouchable despite the growing pressure of to build and expand.
- Potential future settlement areas are defined by their landscape.
- Construction is primarily conducted along the S-Bahn routes and with compatible redensification within already existing urbanised areas.
- Alternative offers for motorized private transport is becoming more and more attractive due to continuous further development.
- Identity-forming features of the townscape will be preserved and strengthened.
- The small-scale cultural landscape in the west will be carefully developed further.
- The eastern district will become denser and increasingly attractive.
- The creation of affordable, needs-based and diverse living space is made possible.
- A sustainable population growth of a maximum of 1% per year (equivalent to approx. 2000 inhabitants) should be maintained.

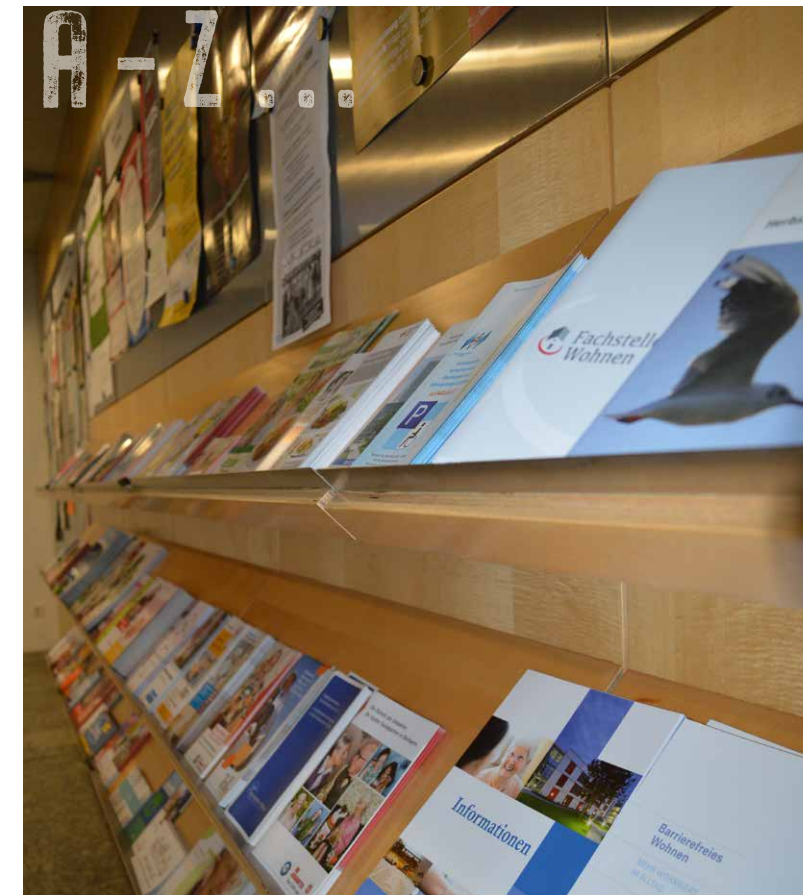
TASKS FROM COUNSELLING CITIZEN SERVICE CENTRE

The Citizens' Service Centre (BSZ) in the Fürstenfeldbruck District Office is one of the first facilities of its kind in a district office in Bavaria. It has been the first point of contact for citizens since 2002. In addition to the professional services offered, applications of all kinds are received and forwarded to the relevant organisational units.

The staff help you navigate the Fürstenfeldbruck District Office or accept suggestions, requests and complaints.

The services offered by the Citizen Service Centre cover the most common procedures in the areas of vehicle registration, driving licence law, immigration, waste management and hunting law. From vehicle deregistration and the reissuance of driving licences to the sale of a waste sack, these matters can usually be dealt with directly in the entrance area without having to wait during extended opening hours. The areas of training support and telephone switchboard are also located there.

Early childhood specialist centre “KoKi”

The specialist centre provides information and advice for expectant parents and families with children aged 0 to 3. The birth of a child changes your entire life. Caring for a child brings a lot of joy and also a lot of effort. Mothers, fathers and families face particular challenges in the early years. KoKi provides information and advice on questions and concerns relating to early childhood and supports families with uncertainties and in stressful life situations.

... EDUCATION

The district of Fürstenfeldbruck is responsible for its **18 schools** (7 academic secondary schools, 4 secondary schools, 2 special needs education schools, 1 upper vocational school, 2 specialised secondary schools and 1 agriculture school).

The district also takes part in supporting the **Waldorf School** in Gröbenzell and pays 50% of the school's costs for the **Cäcilien School** in Fürstenfeldbruck, founded by the Children's Aid Foundation.

Furthermore, the district Fürstenfeldbruck promotes **three music schools**, the Kreis Music School FFB e. V., the Heinrich-Scherrer- Music School Schöngeising e. V. and the Rasso Music School Grafrath e. V.. The district's own building construction department is responsible for the construction and maintenance of the district's buildings.

A modern media centre supplies the schools and providers of extracurricular educational and training facilities with audio-visual media and therefore, fulfils the associated pedagogical responsibilities.

COMMERCE

The Commerce Supervision department (Gewerbeamt) handles processes in the commerce and public-houses law. For some businesses a permission is required, for example guarding or public houses, which can be requested at the Commerce Supervision Department. Further, breaches against the legal trade regulations, such as the Handicrafts Regulation Act (Handwerksordnung), the Shop Closing Act (Ladenschlussgesetz) or specific price regulations are legally prosecuted.

ADMINISTRATIVE PERFORMANCE, PUBLIC HEALTH CARE AND ANIMAL WELFARE PROVISIONS

The administrative enforcement department of the district's office checks compliance with the regulations on animal welfare and animal health, consumer protection, Medical Practitioners Act (Heilpraktikergesetz) and Pharmacy Act (Apothekengesetz). Moreover, inspections are carried out in.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

The district's Economic Development department (Wirtschaftsförderung) is consistently working with targeted measurements for an increasing desirability in regards of the economic location. It functions as a competent intermediary at the exchange point between businesses and administration and thus functions as a reference point for trading, commerce, services and industry.

Regarding maintaining an attractive business location, the economic development department maintains strong relationships with regional companies and actively promotes the development of regional business networks. In addition, it also assists entrepreneurs on their paths to building their start-ups through consultation and events. Consultation on all matters regarding the search for a business location, including location marketing, is a key responsibility of the district's economic development.

VEHICLE REGISTRATION OFFICE AND VEHICLE AND DRIVER'S LICENCE AUTHORITY

The licensing body (Zulassungsbehörde) is the most often frequented office of Fürstenfeldbruck's administration. Every year there are over 60,000 procedures handled, and a further 10,000 vehicle registration processes are carried out in the Citizens Service Centre. Over 165,000 vehicles are registered (as of December 2019).

The Vehicle and Driver's License Authority is (Führerscheinstelle) responsible for all kinds of permits, such as the first issue of driver's licence, including accompanied driving from the age of 17, extension of a driver's license, prolongations, re-registrations, exchanges, passengers transport licenses and international driver's licences.

Its further responsible tasks such as probationary periods and legal measurements of the evaluation system for roadworthiness (German point system),

testing once ability to drive is determined (keyword: MPU, which involves a physical and mental evaluation), revocation and refusal procedure, as well as verification of foreign driver's license.

Driving schools and driving instruction law as well as the local knowledge test for aspiring taxi drivers are also part of this department.

MOBILITY

PUBLIC TRANSPORT MOBILITY SERVICES OF HIGH VALUE

Local public transport (ÖPNV) is very important for the local population, political representatives and transport companies. The most important aspects that guarantee a high passenger satisfaction are excellent accessibility, connections to attractive destinations and the rail network as well as reliable frequency.

Regional bus und RufTaxi

With a range of 49 regional bus routes in the MW and 7 MVV-Ruftaxi routes, the entire district of Fürstenfeldbruck provides a guaranteed area-wide public transport coverage, seven days a week, around the clock.

S-Bahn

The three S-Bahn lines S3 (with the stops Mammendorf, Malching, Maisach, Gernlinden, Esting, Olching and Gröbenzell), S4 (with the stops



Türkenfeld, Grafrath, Schöngeising, Buchenau, Fürstenfeldbruck, Eichenau und Puchheim) and S8 (with the stops Germering-Unterpfaffenhofen and Harthaus) serve the district of Fürstenfeldbruck. They connect the region to the state capital of Munich and the surrounding area.



Regional trains

There are two regional train lines in the district of Fürstenfeldbruck. The stations of Mammendorf, Haspelmoor and Althegnenberg are served by fast regional trains (R980 Augsburg Hbf. – Althegnenberg – Mammendorf – Munich main station.) There is also a regional train connection from Geltendorf (R970 Buchloe – Geltendorf – Munich main station).

Improving the rail network is part of further optimising public transport in the district of Fürstenfeldbruck. Major infrastructure projects in the Munich conurbation include the barrier-free expansion and modernisation of the S-Bahn stations (e.g. Puchheim), the construction of the second S-Bahn main line and the conversion of Munich Central Station as well as the expansion of the S4 in the Fürstenfeldbruck district.

The future of local transport: Mobility 4.0

With the Mobility 4.0 concept, those responsible are facing up to the challenges of the public transport of the future. This includes, for example,

accessibility at stops or the development of mobility stations with rental services for bicycles and cars.

Equally important is marketing to attract new customers, as well as excellent quality and complaint management to ensure that passengers remain satisfied. The digital offensive launched in the district of Fürstenfeldbruck will ensure optimal passenger information and ticketing in the future. A central role in promoting the protection of the climate is the continuous expansion of a supply-oriented public transport system and the use of means of transport with alternative drive systems. A sensible, modern, environmentally friendly and economical expansion of local public transport is ensured by updating the local transport plan.

In accordance with the Bavarian Public Transport Act, the district of Fürstenfeldbruck is responsible for local public transport. The public transport department at the district administration office continuously reviews the basic requirements and develops the service further.

Cycling in the district

The district of Fürstentfeldbruck is very attractive for both every-day and leisure cyclists. This is due to the well-developed network of cycle routes as well as the very scenic views.

In order to adapt the cycle infrastructure to future mobility, a cycle route concept has been created. The aim of the cycle path concept is to eliminate any remaining danger zones and to continuously and sensibly expand the cycle connection network in order to promote cycling. As part of the promotion of cycling, the entire cycle route network was signposted throughout in summer 2020.

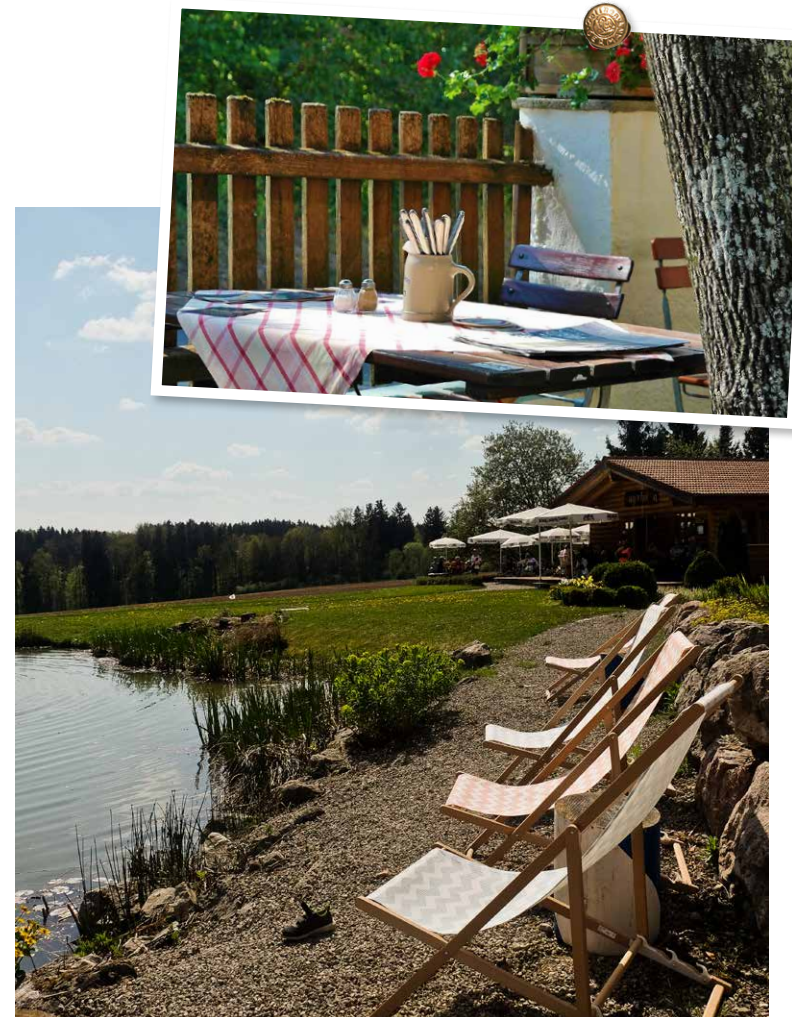
... AND TOURISM

HEALTHCARE

Medical Services

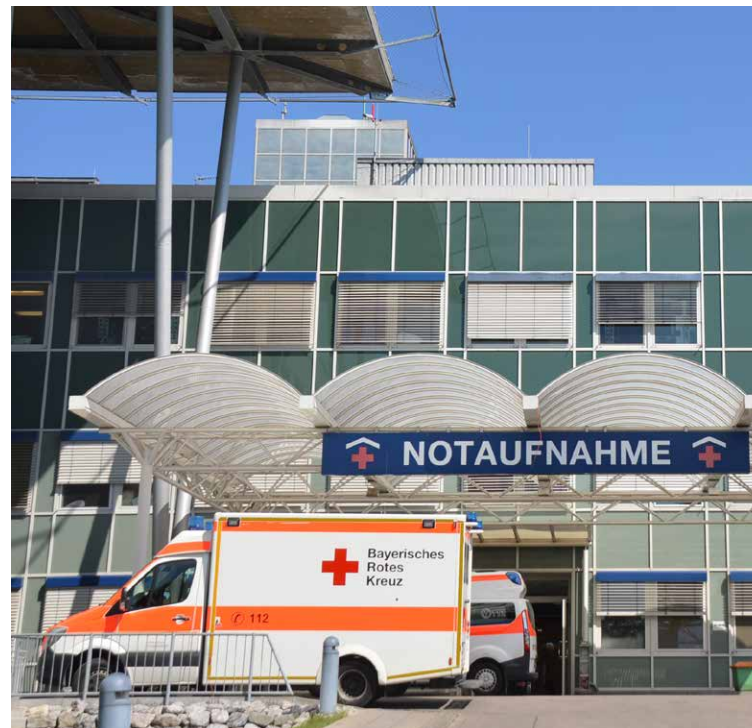
The Health Department (Gesundheitsamt) focuses on the following: hygiene, protection from infections, hygiene in hospitals and registering infectious diseases, investigating sources of transmission, preventing the continued spread of diseases, as well as addressing drinking and bathing water hygiene. The work of the Health Department also entails youth healthcare by providing medical examinations before elementary school enrolment, and screenings for newborns. It involves a socio-pedagogical offer such as counselling services especially for the mentally ill, the addicted, and people at risk; and pregnancy counselling offices as well as addiction prevention.

Guardianship

The guardianship centre is responsible for investigating cases and sending statements to the guardianship court, informing about and advising on the lasting power of attorney, and for creating certificates of the lasting power of attorney

Hospital Fürstenfeldbruck

The Fürstenfeldbruck hospital is part of the municipal company Fürstenfeldbruck/Seniorenheim Jesenwang. It offers the citizens of Fürstenfeldbruck a multitude of services. The medical areas of expertise offer a broad spectrum of diagnostic and therapy therapeutic services to ensure to preserve or restore the well-being of its patients.

VETERINARY MEDICINE, ANIMAL PROTECTION AND FOOD SAFETY ADMINISTRATION

The tasks of the Veterinary Office (Veterinäramt) include animal welfare, animal disease control, monitoring the use of veterinary medicines and the disposal of products as well as monitoring food hygiene in authorised businesses.

Suspensions of animal diseases or an animal rights offence should be notified to the local veterinary office.

The Food Safety Administration (Lebensmittelüberwachung) concerns itself with the inspection of companies which produce, process or sell food.

It monitors the companies on their food safety rules and regulations and the food is tested at.

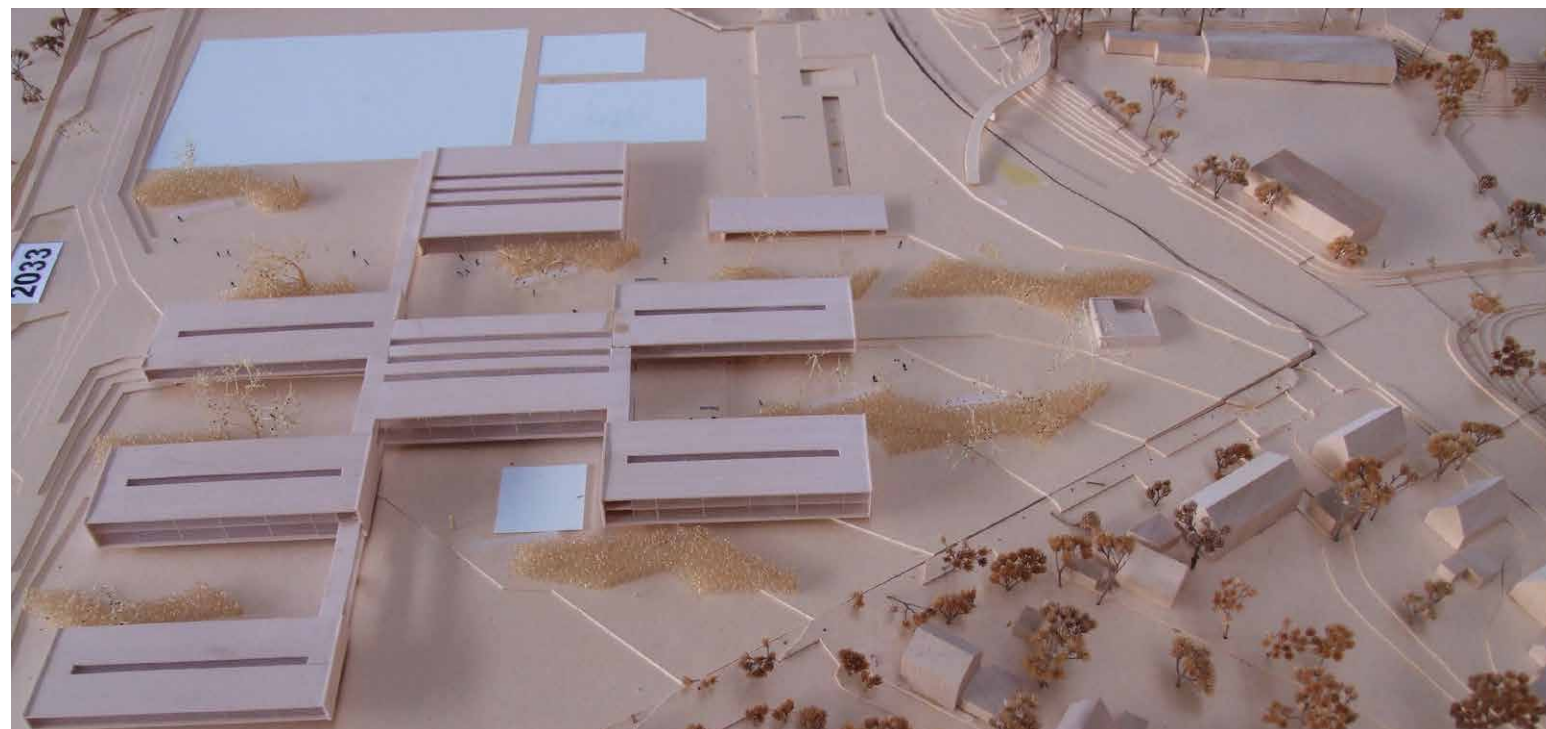

CONSTRUCTION

As a Minor Construction Supervision Office (Untere Bauaufsichtsbehörde), the Construction Office (Bauamt) is responsible for the entire district with the exception of the major district administrations of Fürstenfeldbruck and Germering. Some of its core tasks are the authorization of construction projects as well as monitoring construction work, meeting places, excavations and cultural heritage management.

ENVIRONMENTAL AND CLIMATE PROTECTION

Thanks to the diverse areas of expertise disposal law, emission control, conservation of nature and landscape maintenance as well as water law, the employees are able to contribute to preserving nature, protecting flora and fauna along with creating a low-emission environment.

The district of Fürstenfeldbruck set its sights on implementing the energy turnaround of its first energy conference in 2000 by 2030. They plan on achieving this primarily by savings in energy consumption, the use of renewable energy and the sustainable use of local resources.

To reach these climate goals, they created a CO₂ plan of action, which the district is using as a foundation of its work in the coming years.

Measures of the plan include the further expansion of renewable electricity and heat generation as well as the integration into hydrogen-based storage technologies.

Furthermore, projects such as the photovoltaic campaign or the district-wide STADTRADELN initiative raise awareness of climate-relevant issues and call for collective participation in order to make everyday life more climate-friendly. DISTRICT TEACHING GARDEN

The Adelshofen district teaching garden (Kreislehrgarten) was established by the district association of the horticultural societies (Kreisverband der Gartenbauvereine) with support of the district and many other sponsors. It has been open to the public since 1999 and measures 7,305 m².

The orchard is the main focus of the garden, which boasts roughly 100 different types of fruit trees. The aim is to showcase the diversity and tradition of fruit growing in the region. Simultaneously, the cultivation also serves to preserve almost forgotten fruit varieties in line with the Agenda Convention on biological diversity.

Classes and lectures inform the public not only on the topic of growing fruit but also on vegetable cultivation, woody plants, shrubs, greening of facades, soil maintenance, organic protection of plants, and much more. A beekeeper station provides information about apiculture.

In 2015, a wood-fired oven suitable for baking bread and pizza was added to the garden.

WASTE MANAGEMENT

In addition to the removal of residual waste and the collection of organic waste and recyclable materials, the municipal waste management company also operates 19 large, 4 medium, and 268 small recycling depots, 9 plastic collection points and 12 garden waste collection points as well as a construction waste landfill and sorting plant in Jesenwang.

In the district of Fürstentfeldbruck, strict separation of waste by type is of particular importance. The drop-off system for the collection of recyclable materials makes it possible to charge low fees for waste collection. Thermal waste treatment and deposition of waste in landfills for disposal is organized by the “Joint municipal waste management company, public law entity of the districts of Fürstentfeldbruck and Dachau (GfA)”, which also operates a waste-to-energy plant Geiselbullach in Olching as well as a residual waste landfill in Jedenhofen.

PUBLIC SAFETY AND ORDER

Public safety and order fall under the jurisdiction of the district administration, encompassing a wide array of responsibilities. These include, for example, enforcing legislation related to the right of assembly, Sunday and holiday working hours, use of explosive substances, gaming industry regulations, fisheries, access to weapons, hunting, and administrative offenses. The district administration also operates fire departments and serves as a disaster management authority responsible for the district of Fürstentfeldbruck.

Disaster management

In addition to preventive measures aimed at avoiding disasters or minimizing damage as quickly and effectively as possible, the district administration takes over command, control, and coordination in a state of emergency.

Rescue services and emergency calls

The districts of Dachau, Fürstentfeldbruck, Landsberg am Lech and Starnberg form together a joint body for rescue services and fire alerting system (ZRF FFB). The ZRF FFB is responsible, for example, for establishing and operating an Integrated Control Centre (ILS).

The ILS is located in Fürstentfeldbruck, receives all emergency calls made in the above mentioned districts to the **pan-European emergency number 112** (no dialing code) and dispatches a rescue team/an emergency doctor or alerts a fire brigade.

Ambulance service can also be requested at the ILS FFB by **calling 0 81 41 1 92 22**. When necessary, the ILS alerts not only rescue services and fire departments but also further units, facilities, authorities and personnel.
